



## **Instructions for Import of Leaf Samples from Outside USA**

All customers must **review and sign** this document BEFORE importing any samples from approved countries outside of the U.S.A.

1. The shipment must be accompanied by a copy of Apical APHIS Permit PCIP-19-00228 and this signed form in full.
2. The shipment must be accompanied by an invoice or packing list indicating its contents, which are clearly labeled, and include the permit number (PCIP-19-00228) on the bill of lading.

3. Plant species sampled are one of the following:

<i>Allium sativum</i> (garlic)	<i>Lonicera caerulea</i> (haskap)
<i>Avena sativa</i> (oats)	<i>Malus domestica</i> (apple)
<i>Brassica napus</i> (canola)	<i>Medicago sativa</i> (alfalfa)

<i>Citrus limon</i> (lemon)	<i>Phleum pratense</i> (timothy)
<i>Citrus sinensis</i> (orange)	<i>Pisum sativum</i> (peas)
<i>Citrus paradisi</i> (grapefruit)	<i>Prunus avium</i> (cherry)
<i>Cucumis sativus</i> (cucumber)	<i>Prunus domestica</i> (plum)
<i>Coffea arabica</i>	<i>Rubus fruticosus</i> (blackberry)
<i>Coffea robusta</i>	<i>Rubus idaeus</i> (red raspberry)
<i>Dactylis glomerata</i> (orchard grass)	<i>Solanum lycopersicum</i> (tomato)
<i>Festuca arundinacea</i> (tall fescue)	<i>Sorghum bicolor</i> [sorghum (millet)]
<i>Festuca ovina</i> (hard fescue)	<i>Theobroma cacao</i>
<i>Fragaria × ananassa</i> (strawberry)	<i>Triticum aestivum</i> (wheat)
<i>Glycine max</i> (soybean)	<i>Vaccinium corymbosum</i> (s. highbush blueberry)
<i>Gossypium hirsutum</i>	<i>Vaccinium darrowii</i> (evergreen blueberry)
<i>Hordeum vulgare</i> (barley)	<i>Vaccinium myrtillus</i> (bil-/wim-/whortle-berry)
<i>Ipomoea batatas</i> (sweet potato)	<i>Vitis vinifera</i> (common grape vine)
<i>Lolium perenne</i> (perennial ryegrass)	<i>Zea mays</i> (maize)

4. Samples are grown in one of the following countries:

- a. Canada
- b. Dominican Republic
- c. Ecuador
- d. El Salvador
- e. Guatemala
- f. Honduras
- g. Mexico
- h. Panama
- i. Peru
- j. Saint Vincent and the Grenadines



5. All restrictions and conditions listed on the APHIS permit must be adhered to by the shipper.
6. The imported plant material must be packaged sufficiently to prevent cross contamination during shipment.
7. Imported materials must not be wrapped or otherwise packaged in a manner that impedes or prevents adequate inspection or treatment.
8. The material must be shipped in a sturdy closed container that will prevent the possible escape or introduction of plant pests during shipment.
9. All wood packing material present with this shipment must meet the requirements of the importing and destination country and is subject to ISPM 15 treatment and IPPC stamp requirements and enforcement.
10. The plant materials must be selected from apparently disease-free and pest-free sources, free of federal noxious weeds and soil.
11. The crop sampled is not genetically modified (requires additional licensing).
